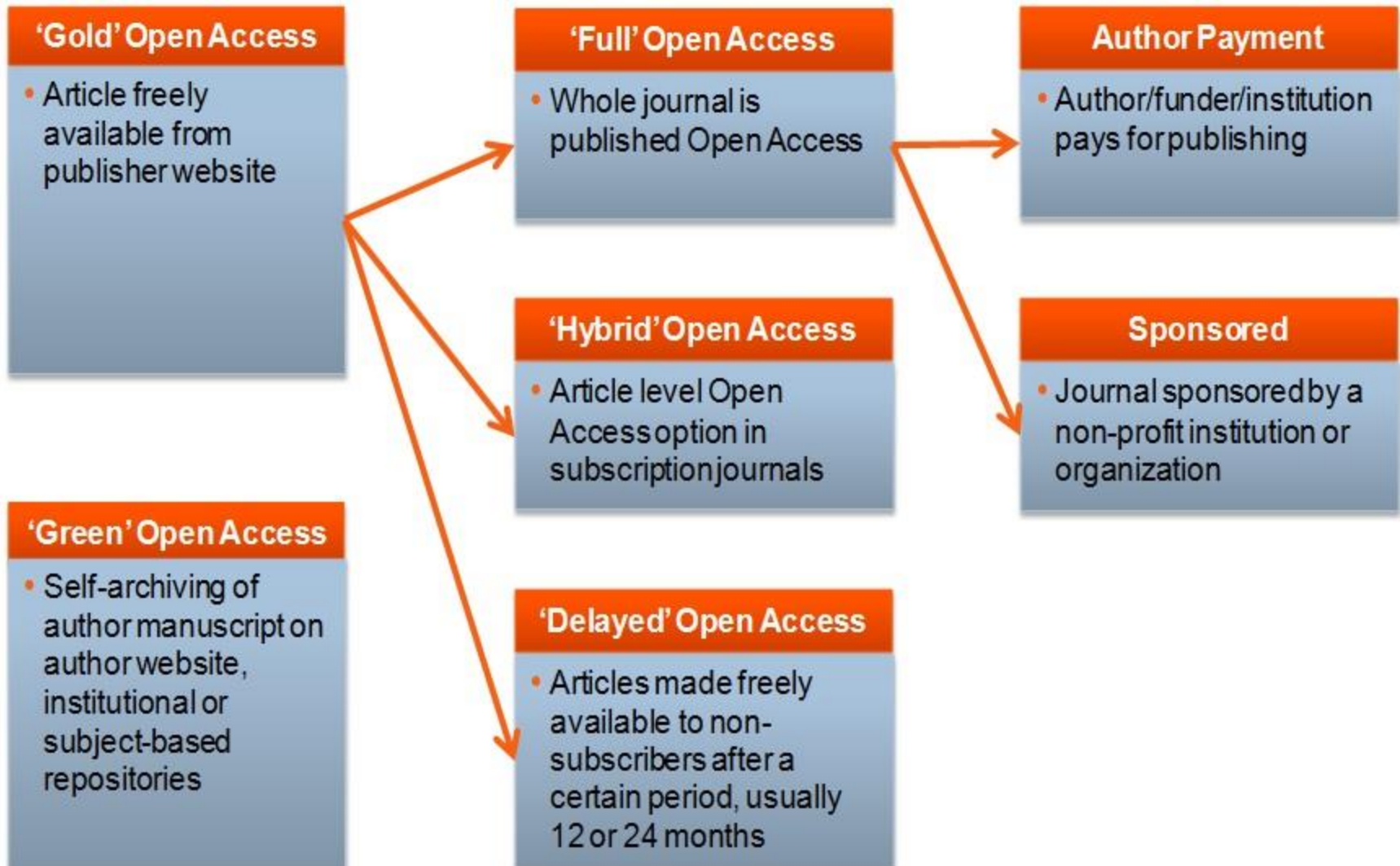




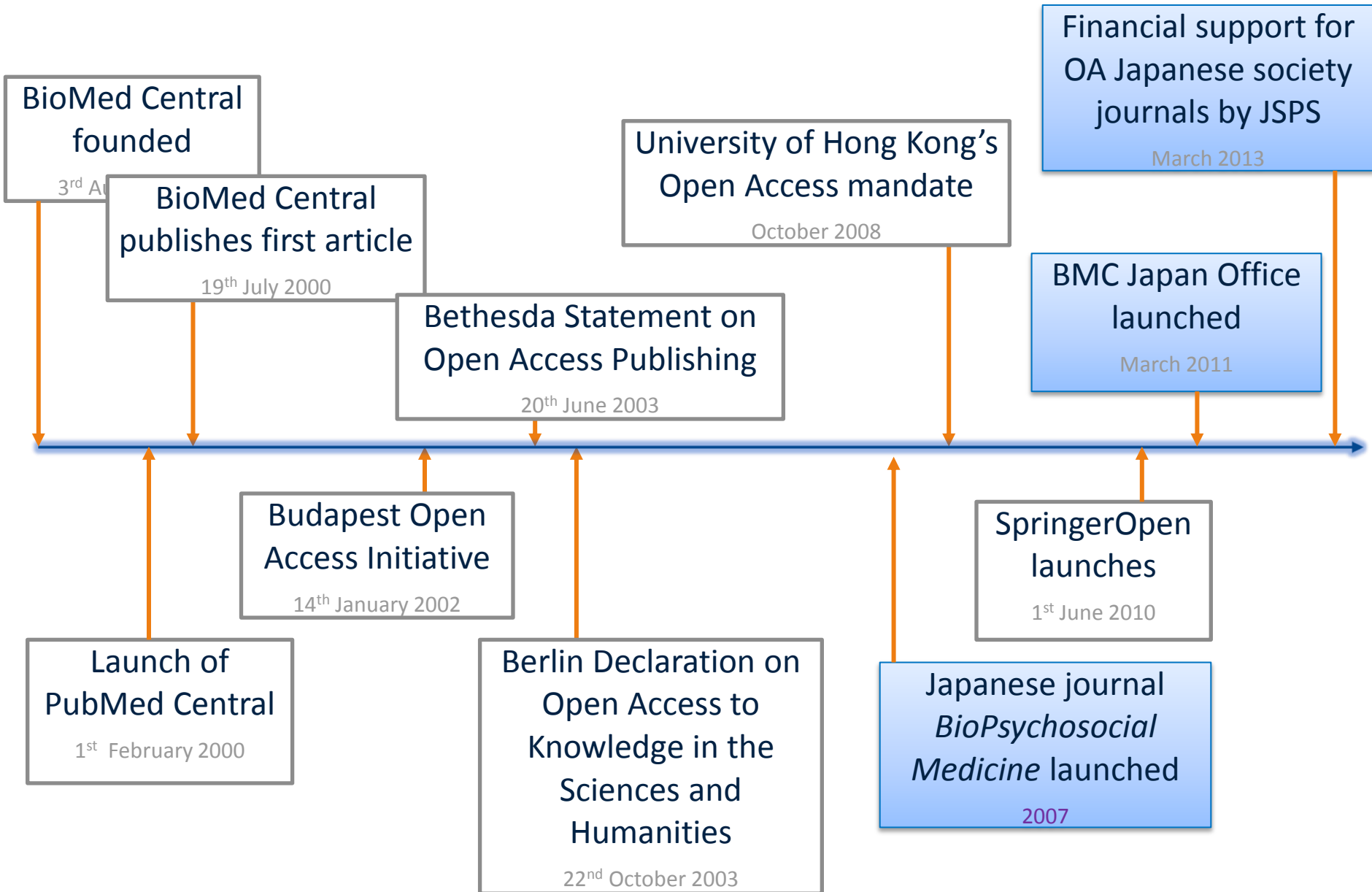

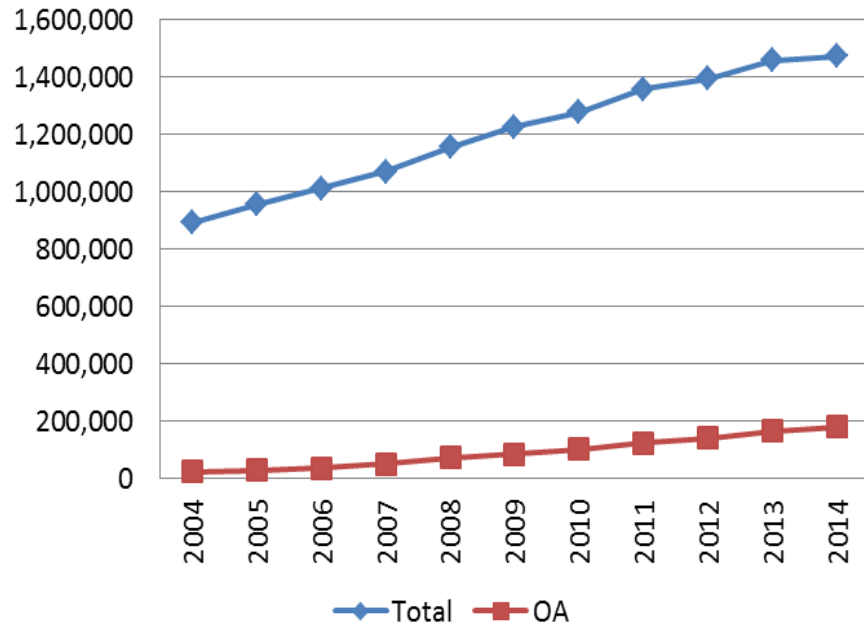


A history of Open Access

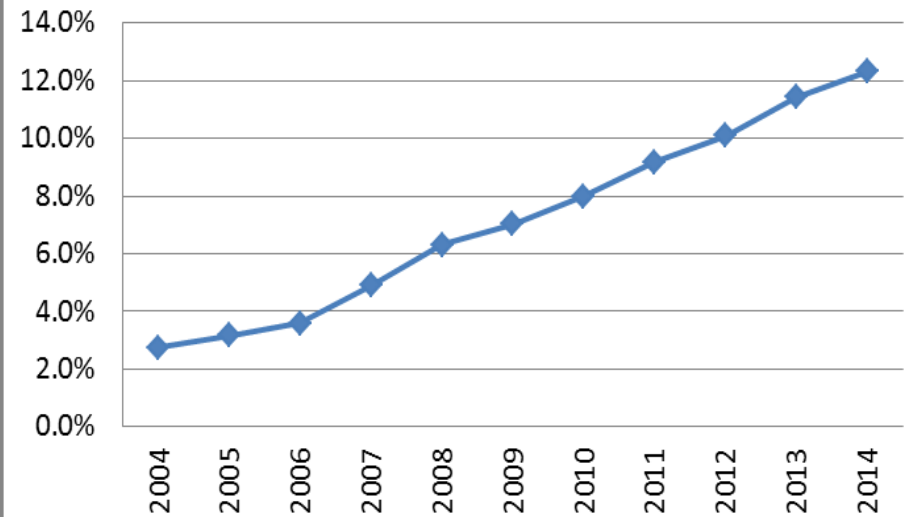


Number of Articles in Web of Science 2004-2014

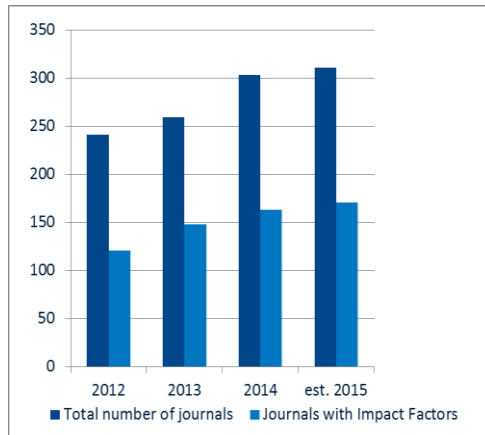
